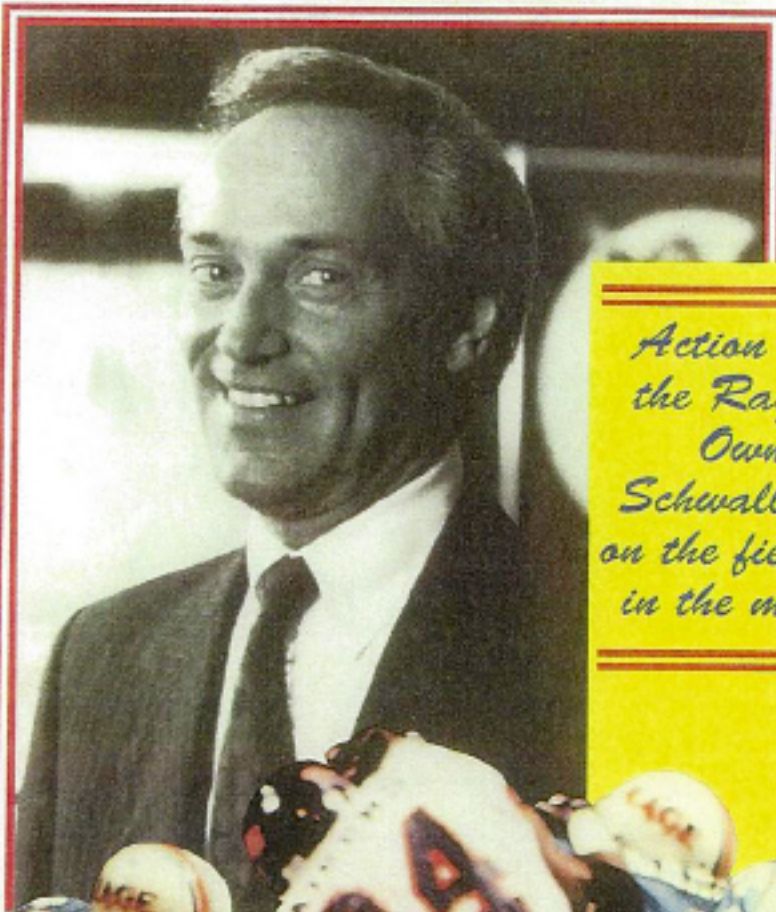
"Superman IV" and "Rocky V."

Over the past 10 years, his limited partnerships have provided one-quarter of a billion dollars to Hollywood's major studios.

He is also on the Board of Governors of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, as well as on the Board of Advisors of the Charlotte Chamber of Commerce.
